Dear Mother & Dad

We have lost all our ink
so this pencil will have to do.
This morning when we got up
it was about 35°F or below that.
Old Faithfull camp is the coldest
we have been in, Donald was
feeling pretty rotten Tuesday night
and Wednesday. yesterday we took
him to a nurse at Yellowstone
camp. She fixed his throat up
and told him to go to bed.

He thought that he could stand
it to ride over to Old Faithfull
where we had planned to stay
that night. We went there but
he was pretty quiet all the way.
We put him to bed as soon as
we got a cabin and he stayed
there until we left this morning
about 8 o'clock. He didn't see

old faithful until this morning
He wasn't very peppy this morning
but tonight he is feeling much
better. We bought medicine
and the nurse gave us the shots
so Jerry is the doctor now.

We are planning on going
through the Anacanda smeltering
plant tomorrow at tea then
drive back to Butte and go through
the Leonard mine. After that
we expect to drive to Spokane.
Saturday we are going down
to Naches, Wash. where Uncle
lives and from there to
Uncle George's. It will probably
be sometime Sunday when
we get there.

Yellowstone was fine but
it really did get tiresome. We drove
884 miles in the park. The people in
Montana have shown us more courtesy
than anywhere else. In Butte a man
snapped out the town and a garage man
gave us a new generator fuse. Some of our
