March 30, 1943

Since Gladie is expecting a baby late in the summer she came home now while she could. Anyway they went with Mary to Jacksonville Saturday and took the car on to Wetwater to visit the Grahams and then met Mary at the train Sunday night. Vincent, according to Mary's letter today, has received his orders to report to the Navy in about a month so Gladie and Kathie have to go back to Boston much earlier than expected. Vince has got a direct commission, which I could

probably have got if I had acted sooner.

The Round Robin dropped in Saturday and it certainly carried a load. If all our war time problems were loaded upon any one of us that one couldn't stand up under the strain. But as individuals we seem to be solving our own problems satisfactorily, and it is nice to pass that information around from one to another. Daisy Lee wrote about six pages on their pending sale.
