Dear mother and dad,

I hope this reaches you on Wednesday morning. I should have sent these invitations out weeks ago but I did not. Then this weekend I didn't get around to it either. I have sent invitations to Jerry, Margaret and Daisy Lu utilizing this space inside to write a note in each case. In that way I have caught up with my correspondence.

I got by the exams ok and now have nothing much to do. This morning we turned in our G.I. clothing. This afternoon we returned our books. That makes us about all cleaned out as far as equipment is concerned. There is a big job of making train reservations but I'm letting mine go until I get home. My assignment is to report to

the Commendant at San Francisco
on June 11. I'll be able to tell you
a bit more when I see you, but not
too much, as, I don't know much
about it myself. All I do know is
that Mary and G. B. will not be able
to come with me. That takes the
edge off of having finished dances, the
dances etc. But there is nothing we
can do about it. We will enjoy ourselves
as much as possible, and make the most
of the ten days I'll have at home.

Your rooms are reserved in Niles
and Mary has the tickets for you. Niles
isn't a big city, but it is nice, and I
understand it would have been impossible
to get good reservations here in South Bend.
We expect to have ^{our} the car all packed ready to
leave immediately after lunch, and go home through
Joliet. I can't wait to see you, and will try
and be in Niles when you come in.
